



Boats Styles and Models

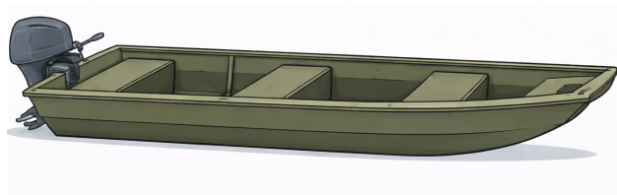
Explore some of the most popular recreational powerboat styles cruising Florida's waterways today.

Use this guide as your starting point to discover the perfect boat for your adventures on the water.

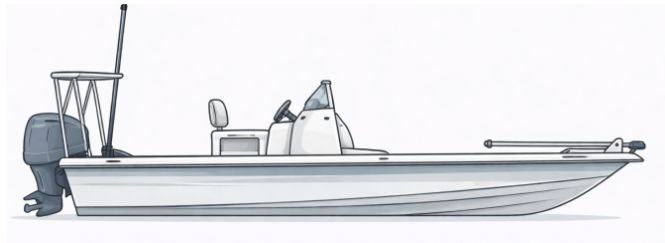
Aluminum Jon Boat

A lightweight, flat-bottom aluminum boat ideal for rivers, lakes, and shallow waters. Very stable at rest, easy to tow, low maintenance, and perfect for fishing, hunting, or simple utility use.



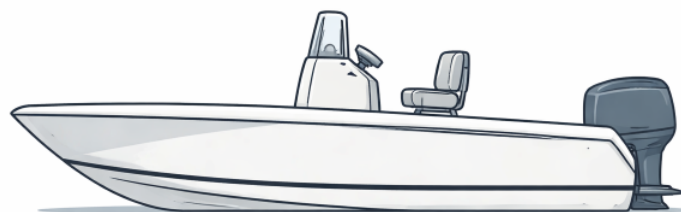
Small Skiff

A compact, simple open boat with a shallow draft. Great for calm waters, inshore fishing, and exploring shallow flats. Skiffs are easy to handle, fuel-efficient, and perfect for beginners.



Center Console

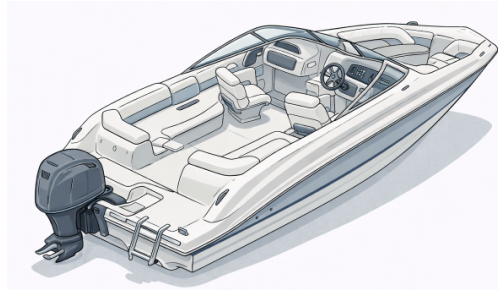
A versatile boat with the helm in the center, giving 360° walk-around space. Ideal for fishing, cruising, and family outings in bay or offshore waters. Comes in many sizes from 16 to +40 ft.





Deck Boat

A wide, open boat with a “deck-boat” shape that maximizes seating and space. Smooth on lakes and bays, perfect for families, entertaining, and cruising, but not ideal for rough offshore



Bowrider

A sporty runabout with open seating in the bow. Great for watersports, day cruising, and casual family use in calm waters. Known for speed, fun, and comfort, but not suited for choppy seas.



Pontoon

A flat deck supported by two or three aluminum tubes (pontoons). Extremely stable and spacious with living-room-style seating. Ideal for lakes, slow cruising, and large groups.





Wake Boat

A purpose-built tow boat with inboard propulsion designed to create large, shaped wakes for wakeboarding and wake surfing. Offers ballast systems, towers, and advanced control features.



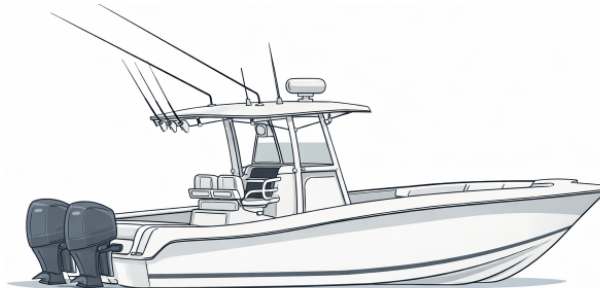
Jet Boat

Propelled by a jet pump instead of a propeller. Very maneuverable, fun, and safe for swimmers. Great for lakes and rivers; shallow-water friendly, but less ideal in heavy waves.



Deep-V Offshore Boat

A hull with a steep V-angle designed to slice through rough seas and built for offshore fishing and long-range cruising. Stable at speed, handles chop extremely well, and is often powered by twin or triple engines.





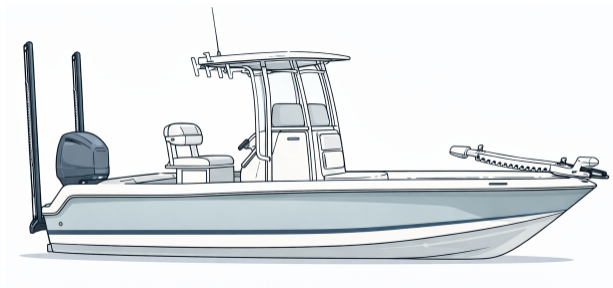
Power Catamaran

A twin-hull boat offering superior stability, a smoother ride, and excellent fuel efficiency. Great for offshore fishing and family cruising with huge deck space and improved comfort.



Bay Boat

A hybrid between inshore and light offshore boats. Shallow draft for the flats but enough V to handle choppy bays. Perfect for fishing mixed waters and family use.



Dual Console

A two-console layout with a walk-through windshield. Family-friendly with more seating, shade, and comfort than a center console. Great for cruising, light fishing, and watersports. Some models include an enclosed head or “Potti” inside one of the consoles.





Cabin Cruiser

A comfortable boat with sleeping quarters, galley, and enclosed head. Designed for overnight trips, weekend getaways, and coastal cruising with the feel of a small yacht.



Pilothouse

A boat with a fully enclosed cabin for the captain, offering protection from the weather. Excellent for year-round fishermen and boaters in colder or wet environments.



Walkaround (WA)

A fishing boat with a small cabin and side decks allowing safe “walk-around” access to the bow. Ideal for families wanting comfort plus serious fishing capability.
